

Hokies Officially Land in Alexandria

Virginia Tech celebrated the opening of Academic Building One in Potomac Yard, cementing the neighborhood as the innovation hub first imagined when AEDP helped win Amazon's HQ2. The graduate programs are built on industry partnerships, preparing students for the demands of the tech-focused workplace, as part of the Commonwealth's \$2 billion investment in Virginia's talent pipeline.

Inova Expands With a Groundbreaking...

A long-awaited transformation in the West End is now underway, with Inova breaking ground on a state-of-the-art hospital and cancer center, a deal made possible by creative use of the Industrial Development Authority of the City of Alexandria and its tools. This catalyst investment will spur 4 million square feet of new development.

Turning Vacancy into Housing Victory

After sitting empty for more than 20 years, the 600,000+ square foot Victory Center office building at 5001 Eisenhower Avenue will become 376 workforce and affordable housing units.

The creative use of a partial real estate tax abatement for this huge housing investment by Stonebridge represents the first time this economic development tool has been used for a residential project in Alexandria. Conversion and reuse of obsolete office is an important part of AEDP's office vacancy strategy.

Cornerstone Craftsman Is Building a Future-Proof Workforce

Roberto Gomez sought to build the apprenticeship program he needed as a young man and succeeded beyond his expectations. This year he moved his trade skills and mentoring programs for at-risk youth out of his living room into an expanded space, thanks to the help of the AEDP Small Business team. He currently serves 36 pre-apprentices with 26 more on a waitlist.

AEDP Responds to Federal Changes

AEDP and the City of Alexandria continue to respond to the ongoing changes at the federal level.

We worked with regional leaders to establish a webinar series for anyone looking for support with a job search or pivoting to entrepreneurship and held a candid listening session on how changes are affecting small businesses and contractors.

The City and AEDP also worked with Rep. Don Beyer to host a job fair attended by more than 2,400 jobseekers.

The 2025 Alexandria Economic Summit

For the first time in 15 years, City leadership, businesses, and community members gathered to collaborate on the future of the City's economy. Led by AEDP, the Summit was the capstone to a massive community engagement effort with more than 840 touchpoints and interviews with more than 75 stakeholders to gather feedback on how to drive equitable economic growth.

A Cabinet-Level Agency Announces a Move to Alexandria

The U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) announced in June that it would relocate its 2,700 employees to Alexandria, moving into the Eisenhower Avenue building that currently houses the National Science Foundation (NSF) and bringing the first cabinet-level agency to the City.






